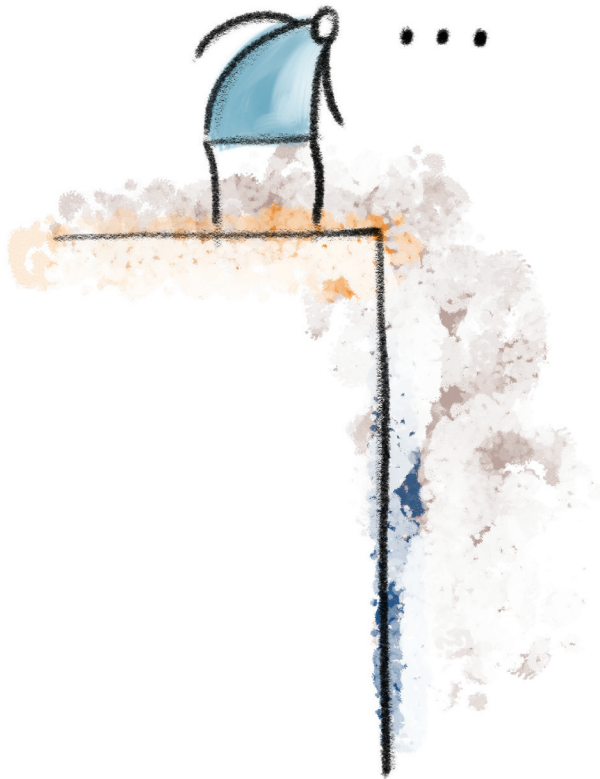

When somebody dies we can also have lots of questions. You might have asked some of these yourself:

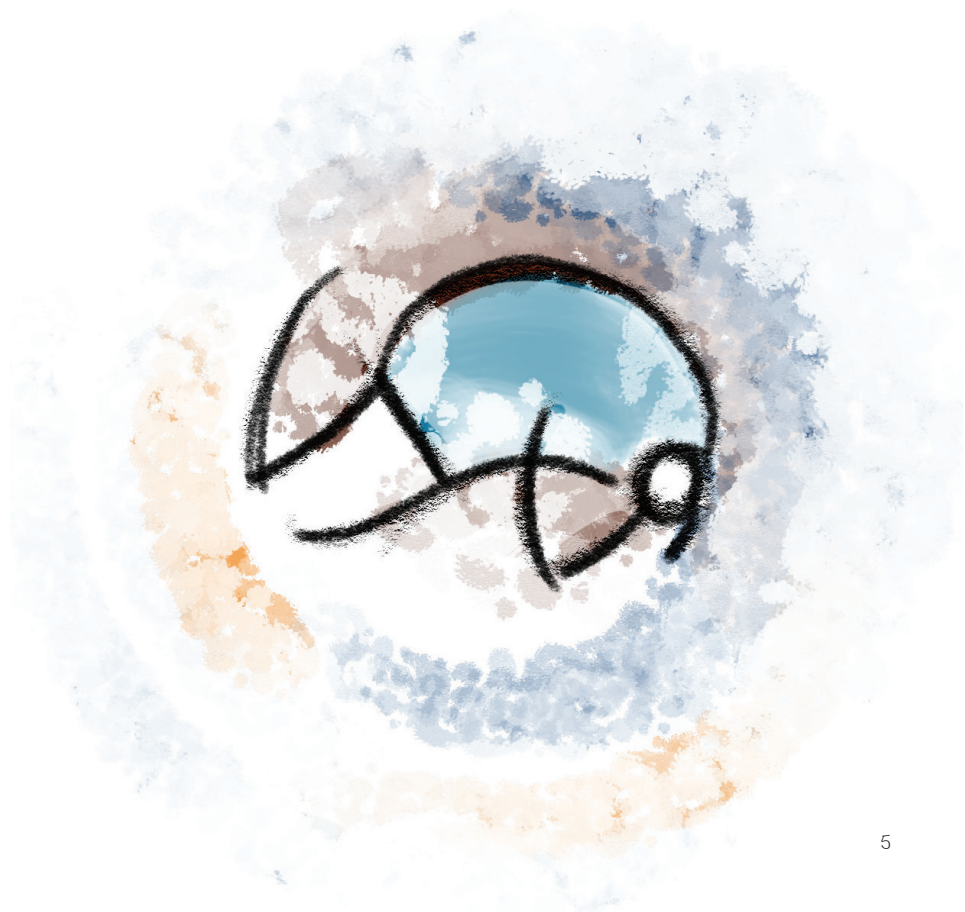
Why did they die now?

I prayed they wouldn't die - why didn't God answer me?

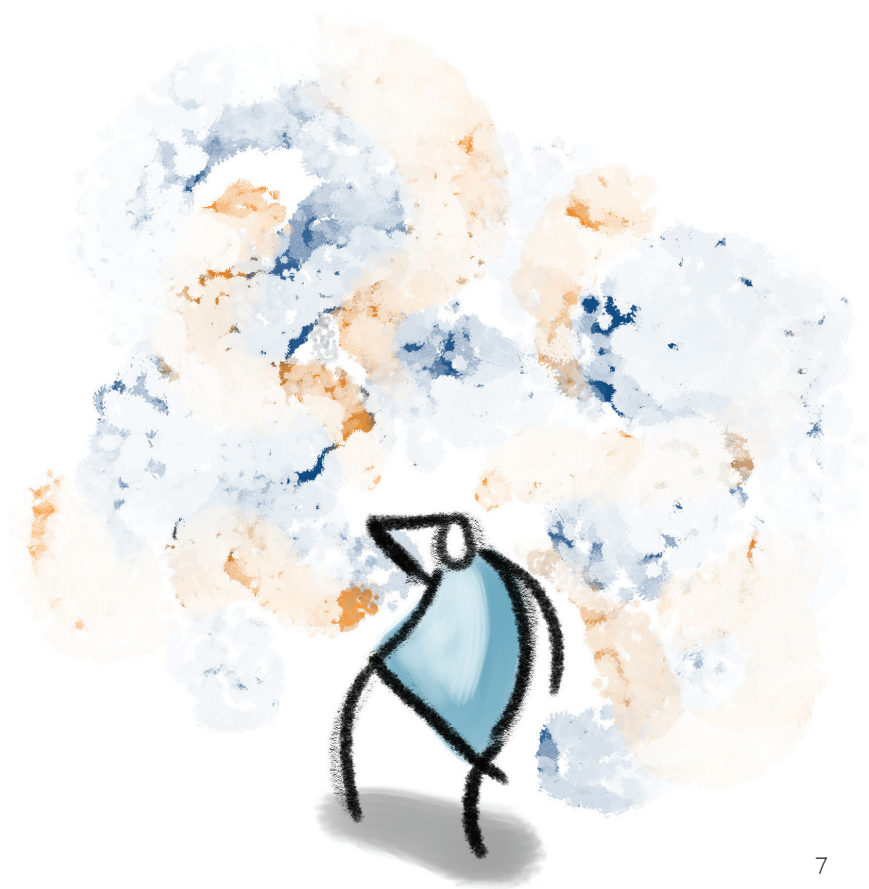


It can be hard not knowing the answers to these questions.

However, God might answer our prayers in a way we don't expect.

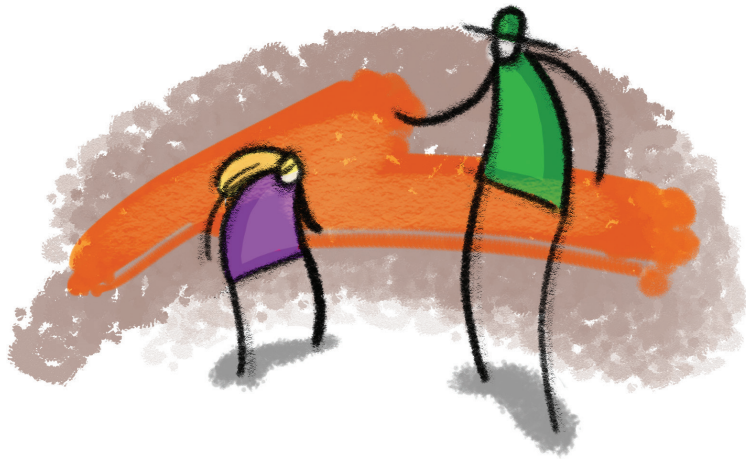


There is lovely story of a girl called Ruth and her best friend, Terry. Terry had a dreadful accident one day, while playing in the woods near his home.
