now into the ark, and don’t be afraid.”

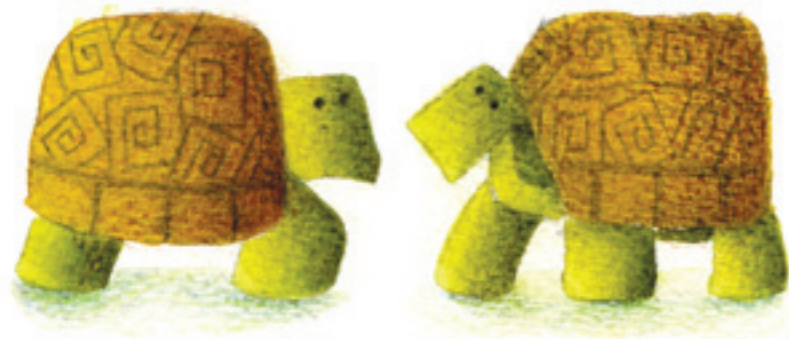
